Jajpur municipality recorded highest 79 pc polling. In Nabarangpur district, election was withheld and repolling announced due to technical glitches in EVM in Umerkote.


Reportedly, Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) recorded 50% polling while Cuttack Municipal

Administration sources said the three municipalities recorded average polling at about 62.66 pc, a drop of about 16.34 pc against rural polls.

Corporation (CMC) recorded 65% polling. Similarly, Berhampur Municipal Corporation (BeMC) recorded 47% polling.

SEC Padhi added that the election was held for 47 Municipalities, 59 NACs, and 3 Municipal Corporations across the State. A total of 40.55 lakh voters exercised

Odisha cop shoots himself with service revolver in Ganjam, dies

Ganjam SP Brijesh Rai said the inspector was suffering from depression for the past few weeks and could have shot himself for that reason.

Bhubaneswar, March 25: A 40-year-old inspector of a police station in Ganjam district of Odisha died after he shot himself with his service revolver on Friday afternoon.

Police officials in Ganjam said the inspector-in-charge of Gangapur police station of the district, died after he fired two rounds at his stomach while he was in his official residence on Friday



afternoon. He used to live with his mother in the police quarters. Ganjam SP Brijesh Rai said the inspector was suffering from depression for the past few weeks and could have shot himself for that reason.

"He seemed mentally disturbed over something. This afternoon he left for his residence for lunch. But moments later, the staff at the police station heard two gunshots. The police official was found lying in a pool of blood. He had joined the Gangapur police station four months ago. He was taken to

the Aska community health centre soon after the incident, where he was declared dead by the doctors," said Rai.

The SP said the circumstances under which the cop died is being probed. The police officer was very sincere and efficient.

The officer's wife also works as a police inspector in Nabarangpur district. He has two sons who live with his wife.

BJD Secures All Mayoral Posts, 76 Councils in Odisha Municipal Polls

Bhubaneswar, Maarch 26: In addition, the ruling camp has secured the positions of mayor and chairperson in all 76 bodies. With the municipal laws recently amended,



Continuing its winning streak, the ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) swept municipal elections on Saturday, capturing 76 of 108 urban local bodies. The party won 766 of the 852 Zilla Parishad seats in 30 districts in last month's panchayat elections.

this is the first time that people in Odisha can directly elect mayors of corporations, chairpersons of municipalities and NACs, in addition to ward councillors.

Of the 105 municipalities and notified area councils (NACs) in the state, the BJD emerged victorious in 73, while the BJP managed to secure just 16, followed by the Congress at seven. Nine urban local bodies were secured by Independents.

The Naveen Patnaik-led party also registered its win in the three municipal corporations of Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Berhampur. Thanking the people for re-imposing faith in his party, BJD President Naveen Patnaik, in a tweet, said:—"Thank all the people of #Odisha for the overwhelming support in #OdishaMunicipalElection. The win is a reflection of the outpouring of love for @bjd_odisha and the untiring effort of thousands of party workers. #OdishaLovesBJD"

He also congratulated all winning BJD candidates and appreciated the hard work of party workers.

BJD's candidate Sulochana Das, who was elected to the post of mayor in Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, expressed her gratitude to people in the state capital for her victory. "I am touched by the love people have showered on me despite being a newbie in politics, the journalist-turned-BMC mayor said.

Similarly, senior BJP leader and Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has congratulated all winning BJP candidates and thanked the people who have voted for the BJP in the urban election.

Two Members Of Bihar's Notorious 'Nut Gang' Held In Bhubaneswar For Cash Snatching

Bhubaneswar, March 21: The Commissionerate Police on Monday arrested two members of the notorious 'Nut Gang' of Bihar who were involved in a series of cash snatching incidents near various banks in Bhubaneswar recently. The accused have been identified as Badal Gowala (34) and Aniket Das (22). Police said the accused

Bhubaneswar DCP, Umashankar Dash said that the criminals were involved in at least 4 cash snatching incidents between March 5 and March 10. They had looted a total of around Rs 12 lakh



cash in all the cases which were reported from Saheed Nagar, Kharavela Nagar and Chandrasekharpur police station limits.

It is suspected that

members of the same Biharbased criminal gang were involved in a Rs 7 lakh cash loot case in Rourkela recently.

"We stepped up patrolling near banks after the bag (cash) snatching incidents witnessed a rise. One of our teams gave some criminals a chase on March 10, but they managed to escape," said Dash.

Dash further said that the

two accused are part of the notorious Nut Gang of Bihar and they use stolen motorcyles to commit crimes. They mostly targeted people on their return from banks after withdrawing cash. "We appeal hotel owners to share details photographs of their visitors. This will help the police to strengthen security measures," Dash added.

Prices vs. Petrol

Subsidise petrol, check prices, kick-start economy, get more revenue

The country needs a new approach on prices, taxes tolls and issues of progress. It wants to control prices as often the leaders proclaim and then go on increasing every bit that is under the administrative control.

India must rethink introducing fuel subsidies to boost manufacturing and other activities that could bring more revenue to the nation's kitty. Cut in prices to generate more manufactured goods sales and revenues.

Post-poll the prices are rising almost 85 to 90 paise a day on the plea of rising crude prices. But the companies did not reduce prices when crude prices crushed to a virtual zero during the pandemic. The high fuel prices have stoked inflation as transport prices spiral making goods and

commodities expensive when the people need relief.

The administration says that the petroleum companies decide the prices but despite supposed 'genuine' needs they freeze prices for over a month during elections. It may be a coincidence but that is repeated poll to poll.

Rightly, the Ukrainian situation has put the country in difficult situation but wisely it could firm up an agreement with Russia for continued fuel supply. That is prudent though was not easy in an era of US-led sanctions. The balancing act is possible because of India's moral authority under Prime Minister Narenda Modi the corps of diplomats.

The world can see that

Sri Lanka has failed in doing it and again Indian Oil has to come to its rescue by continuing fuel supplies and keep running its power plants. Sri Lanka is in deep economic crisis. Rice is being sold there for Rs 500 a kg and all commodity prices are soaring. Inflation spikes to 14 percent. India has over 13 percent wholesale and 6 percent retail inflation. Income level in India is either thawed or postcovid at a low level. Lanka got into the crisis as it deliberately chose to go into Chinese ambit to keep off India. Its main foreign exchange reserves shrunk to reckless borrowings from China to finance infrastructure projects, according to Hong Kong Post.

Successive governments in India have been using petroleum as a tax-spinner forgetting that even a paisa hike on petrol has cascading effect on the entire economy. Since the UPA times the economy is dependent on taxes on fuel leading to its collapse to 'mahngai dain'. The successive administration should have learnt and corrected it. The problem accelerated as domestic production plummeted to around 20 percent and dependence on imports increased causing the rupee to slide beyond Rs

It has led to overall price spiral. Wholesale and retail prices are going beyond the toleration level. Sunflower oil jumps by 20 percent to Rs 182, soya oil sells at Rs 162, dearer

by 10 percent; and palm oil Rs 151.80 dearer by 13.65 percent. Mustard oil, wheat, rice, pulses rise by over two percent. Textiles and other commodities are also becoming dearer.

Alternate fuel like ethanol, processed largely from sugarcane, is being proposed for mixing with petrol. It is likely to make sugar expensive. It is a myth that it would sell cheap. Processing cost is high. Ethanol production can, according to US studies, cause air, water pollution, soil erosion and habitat loss. It is being seen to benefit Maharashtra growers. Apart ethanol is not supposed to be engine friendly with its high moisture.

The Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2021 on which battery recharging is to be based would make coal and power dearer. Apart more use of batteries will lead to higher coal generated power production causing heavy emission pollution and spike power rates. Power workers are planning two-day strike shortly against the bill as it encourages privaisation.

In the months leading up to the Covid-19 pandemic, U.S. oil production hit an all-time high of just below 13 million barrels per day (BPD). As the pandemic unfolded, demand collapsed, and production followed. By May 2020, oil production had dropped by more

than 3 million BPD to 9.7 million BPD.

India's domestic crude oil production has steadily decreased in recent years. In 2013-14, Indian companies produced 37.8 million tonnes of crude oil and condensate. That dropped to 32.2 million tonnes in 2019-20, a sharp slide of 15 per cent. India produced 35.68 MTs of crude petroleum in 2017-18.

During the last over 15 years it was noticed that as petrol prices rise, the economy gets into a spin. Under World Bank and IMF pressure India gave up subsidies causing immense harm to the poor, middle and small enterprises, prices of commodities. A little subsidy not direct benefit helps every section of the society. Small hair cut is always preferable than its total loss. It is a myth than India has a rich class of people and the middle class is able to fend for themselves.

There is nothing like a middle class except that they are slightly above the poverty level. A bumpy situation hits them hard. Overall subsidies benefit a larger population and help the economy keep prices under check. The nation unfortunately continued with the policies of Manmohan Singh instead of correcting it.

India needs to understand the Lankan stress on infra that drained its resources.

India must go slow on infra now. Infrastructure builds expensive assets with a higher recurring expenditure that stresses the economy severely. Had it conserved its reserves, put expensive infrastructure projects, Lanka could have avoided getting into the amiss. Increased money supply, infra investments depreciation of the rupee stoked inflation there.

The Ukrainian situation has disturbed the oil supplies across the world. India has hedged it for now with the promise of Russian supplies. World leaders could have influenced+ Russian leader Vladimir Putin to put seize of Ukraine and not go into a full-fledged war. Today, it has put Europe into a tinder box. For the folly of the NATO and European countries, poor countries like India suffer the most.

The symptoms of Lankan and Indian economy are not different except that India has the capacity and size to sustain which Lanka does not have.

It would be prudent on the part of India to reintroduce subsidies on petrol as alternate energy is yet not available. It would change dynamics of economy, generate more revenue and can do better if infra is put in the backburner and manufacturing is boosted to give the economy a kick-start.

RSP-State Govt join hands to enhance Fishermen's income



Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP) has joined hands with State Government to develop pisciculture for ensuring food security and livelihood of the fisherfolk living in the adjoining areas of Mandira Reservoir, a captive water body of RSP. As a part of capacity building, technological intervention, awareness building, and education of fisherfolk and other stakeholders programs were organized at Laing and Dumerjore, the Model Steel Villages cum Resettlement Colonies of RSP situated in Rajganpur and Kuarmunda Blocks for two days on 16th and 17th March.

Around 250 fishing nets were distributed

community of the two villages. This program has incurred a cost of Rs. 11.21 Lakh over the distribution of fishing net and training.

To improve the lives of the fishermen, the project was launched last year on 18th November. More than 2 lakhs of fingerlings belonging to the three different species of Rohu, Bhakura, and Mackerel were released in the backwaters of Mandira Dam in the later part of 2021 in presence representatives from CSR, Fisheries Department of Government of Odisha, and Fisherman Co-operative Society of the village. The project aims to tap the untapped potential of aquaculture to ensure livelihood and contribute towards food and nutritional security.

The members of the Fisherman Co-operative Society of the villages were trained on scientific fish farming, fishing methods, and safety precautions. Inputs were provided on various Government schemes for tapping resources required by the group. Ms. Sashmita Kisan (JFTA - Rajganpur), Ms. Shradhanjali Sahoo, JFTA (Kuarmunda) facilitated the groups along with CSR Officials in their respective areas. Sundargarh Collector Nikhil Pavan Kalyan and PK Satapathy, ED (P&A), RSP attended the net distribution function held at Laing. Mr. Kalyan praised the initiatives of RSP and emphasized more such fishing schemes to combat malnutrition and improve the quality of life in the region. Mr. Satapathy in his address assured that RSP will step up its efforts to extend further help to the fishermen of the region to enhance their earnings.

four ULBs of Jeypore, Koraput, Sunabeda and Kotpad. According to preliminary reports, 63 pc polling was recorded in Koraput municipality, 52 pc in Jeypore municipality, 55 pc in Sunabeda municipality and 70 pc in Kotpad NAC. The administration had made elaborate arrangements and security was beefed up in booths termed sensitive.

In Jeypore, there were reports of a commotion over fake voters in Sambar Tota school and a minor clash between two groups in Jaynagar area. Many voters from Ward 21, 22 and 26 alleged that they were unable to exercise their franchise as their names were missing from the voters' list. The situation was brought under control after police intervened.

Kendrapara municipality saw many first-time voters this time. Of 36,718 voters, around 4,000 were newly added to the list. As a result, many candidates of various political parties were banking heavily on young people who flocked to the meetings and rallies, said Dhiren Sahoo, a senior BJD leader. Kendrapara municipality recorded 74.31 pc polling

on the day.

In Kalahandi district, Bhawanipatna Municipality reported just over 50 pc polling with 51.38 pc voter turnout. Dharmagarh, Junagarh and Kesinga NACs reported 74.70 pc, 71.45 pc and 70.99 pc voting respectively. The polling was more or less peaceful in all the four centres, except for a stray incident of tension between BJD and BJP workers in Junagarh NAC.

Polling was overall smooth in Malkangiri district too. Malkangiri municipality recorded 63.61 pc voter turnout and Balimela NAC 74.17 pc. Elections for Sundargarh, Rajgangpur and Birmitrapur ULBs also concluded peacefully amid low polling percentage compared to the just concluded rural elections in Sundargarh district.

Administration sources said the three municipalities' recorded average polling at about 62.66 pc, a drop of about 16.34 pc against rural polls. Jharsuguda saw 68.36 pc polling in Jharsuguda municipality, Brajrajnagar municipality and Belpahar municipality in the district.

Illegal sand lifting flourishes under nose of district administration

Some residents said the sand lifting was stopped that lasted only four to five days after someone made viral a video of the illegal sand lifting at bridges sites on social media. Again the illegal sand lifting of sands resumed as before.

Baripada Tehsildar Bikram Kishore Parida said that he had ordered officers to conduct a raid to check the illegal practice.

A wild bear suffering from severe injury dies on Friday

Baripada, March 28: A wild bear suffering from severe injuries was being treated. Its condition deteriorated allegedly due to poor treatment by the concerned department died on Friday afternoon.

The wild animal was found straying to the human settlement of Purunapani village under Thakurmunda range within Karanjia forest division of Mayurbhanj district for the last couple of days and it created panic to residents. Either it pleaded for treatment from the severe injuries or got aggressive for the same cause had frequently strayed

into the human settlement from S i m i l i p a l forest. Risk of his attack, the local people could not take any steps to rescue them from the injury treatments. The residents



alleged that the injuries which were spotted on the animal's back portion of the body were either made by an arrow or poachers trying to kill it.

This afternoon, the bear last breathed, thanks to the forest department and veterinary doctor of STR for their apathy towards the injured wild bear.

Contacted, the Deputy Range Officer of Thakurmunda range, Kishor Panigrahi said that the infighting between two bears was the reason behind injuries of the wild bear. The infighting was suspected to have taken place around eight days back, and the injury later turned to septic, consequently, the animal died.

A veterinary doctor of STR reached the range officer this afternoon, and the autopsy will be on Saturday morning.

Shortage of professors, and poor space hit medical services in RDC of PRM MCH

Baripada, March28: Resentment is brewing among the patients as the Radio Diagnosis Imagine department of Pandit Raghunath Murmu Medical College and Hospital (PRM MCH) at Baripada in Mayurbhanj district delivers poor health services due to shortage of doctors and poor space in RDC campus.

Official sources said a Professor post is lying vacant from first November 2021, a Senior Resident(SR) post out of two sanctioned is vacant from February 2022 and an Associate Professor post has been vacant when Baripada district headquarters hospital was upgraded to a medical college and hospital from 2017.

Similarly, at least two out of seven radiographers' posts are lying vacant since it became a medical college and hospital. The two radiographer posts have been reserved for ST.

Vacant of the major posts in the Radio Diagnosis Imagine department of the medical college hits the healthcare facilities to patients. The poor space in the department also causes problems for patients to move from one department to another department.

There a good number of patients come to the

department every day from the district and patients from fringe villages of Balasore district and outside States like West Bengal and Jharkahnd.

A medical staff member, who anonymity her name, said that more than 250 patients have come to the department for X-ray reports and more than 150 patients have come for ultrasound reports. Due to poor space, the patients are waiting outside department under open sky. The patients are facing inconvenience to get test reports from the department as major posts are lying vacant. Saroj Kumar

Mohanty, a resident of Purnachandrapur Ward No-15 in Baripada municipality said that he had to wait more than four hours to get his ultrasound report. He said that due increasing of patients' number, the staff of the department had advised the patients to come in next days and the emergency and critically cases were immediately handled in the department he said.

The Principal of the medical institution and The Director of Medical Education and Training (DMET) should intervene into the matter as it was a health related issue, demanded some patients.

NGT lens on recovery of mining money



CUTTACK, March 18: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the

district magistrate & collector (Keonjhar) to appear before it in connection with the

recovery of Rs 7.30 crore as environmental compensation from those involved in illegal mining of laterite stone in Madanpur under Ghasipura tehsil

Expressing dissatisfaction over the sluggish pace of recovery, NGT's east zone bench in Kolkata asked the district magistrate & collector (Keonjhar), along with the Ghasipura tehsildar "to be present physically before the tribunal on April 29".

The green body issued the order after state counsel Samapika Mishra informed on Tuesday that a total amount of Rs 2,21,746 had been recovered as on that day.

The tribunal observed that the total recovered amount is just 0.25% of the 7.30 crore environmental compensation computed to be recovered from illegal miners in 2019. The bench of Justice B Amit Sthalekar (judicial member) and Justice Saibal Dasgupta (expert member) directed the government to file an affidavit indicating what steps have been taken for the recovery of the remaining amount.



Breakdown of neutrality in bureaucracy



Four months before India began its "tryst with destiny", the nascent nation's first Home Minister, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, played a critical role in integrating the princely states into the Indian Union, spoke to the first batch of Indian Administrative Service officers at Metcalf House in Delhi. In that special address on April 21, 1947, Patel outlined the task before civil servants in an Independent India and laid down certain principles of 'Surajya' or good governance.

"Your predecessors were brought up in the traditions in which they kept themselves aloof from the common run of the people. It will be your bounden duty to treat the common men in India as your own," he said on April 21, a date marked ever since as 'Civil Services Day.

However, his role in establishing the modern-day IAS institution in place of the Britishera Indian Civil Services (ICS) goes a lot further than that landmark address

Home Minister Sardar Patel to the first batch of IAS officers Post-Independence said- "Today, my Secretary can write a note opposed to my views. I have given that freedom, to all my Secretaries. I have told them, 'If you do not give your honest opinion for fear that it will displease your Minister, please then you better go. I will bring another Secretary.' I will never be displeased over a frank expression of opinion." "Sardar's heart was big enough to appreciate merit and he wanted the services to be steadfast to their traditions of efficiency, impartiality, and equality. However, the real test for Patel came after Independence.

The IAS was suggested to be controlled by the Federal (Union) Public Service Commission of the Central Government, though the officers might be posted in various provinces". Patel, once again, had his way, and provisions offering special safeguards to those in the services were inserted into the Constitution under Article 312(2) in Part XIV, giving birth to the modern IAS and IPS.

In October 1951, Parliament passed the All India Services Act, which laid down the rules of recruitment and service conditions. Patel, unfortunately, had met his demise on December

15, 1950, nearly a full year before the All India Services Act was passed in Parliament. However, by then, Patel had established an institution that has stood the test of time producing officers with a range of capabilities or generalists to oversee different aspects of administration.

After independence the deterioration of political values begins. So does a sea of changes took place in performance by the Bureaucrats. All India service officers are nowadays are more loyal to the state governments rather than their parent government in the Center. Appallingly they have gone miles away from their training and probation. Contrastingly, most have readopted the behavior of their erstwhile ICS fraternity. The behavior of the former CS of Bengal during the cyclone has been a burning example. Wrong interpretations of federalism by some state governments patronize grades down the performing value of the bureaucrats. All India cadre officers should by heart and sould be neutral as they are the real representative of the Union government to help, guide, and

monitor the functioning of the concerned state governments. For any deviation, they are duty-bound to bring it to the notice of the state government and the union government as well.

After the success of the state's ruling Party, IAS, IPS officers of Odisha congratulated the Chief Minister on BJD's victory in local polls. It had raised many eyebrows and drawn flak by the political parties and the public in general. However, when there is a change of guards in government after a general election, the top bureaucrats normally meet the new leader to get acquainted with the new government. But in Odisha, the ULB polls don't get a change of government; hence congratulating the CM on this occasion stamps the numerous allegations leveled as authentic.

The Bharatiya Janata Party and Congress in Odisha said on Monday that there was a complete breakdown of neutrality in the Odisha bureaucracy, a day after senior IAS and IPS officers congratulated Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for the Biju Janata Dal's victory in the rural and urban polls. The two Opposition parties said instead of aiding the political leadership in running the government, bureaucrats have become "collaborators in political activities" in the State.

According to the Chief Minister's Office, Chief Secretary Suresh Mohapatra and Director General of Police Sunil Kumar Bansal on Sunday led IAS and IPS officers respectively to congratulate Mr. Patnaik on the twin wins. Besides, officers of the Odisha Administrative Services, Odisha Police Service Association, and other associations too joined in to wish the Chief Minister.

"The gesture is not in good taste. IAS and IPS officers, who belong to the all-India cadre, bowing before the head of a political party violate ethics. Different service association members meeting the BJD supremo vindicates allegation that the ruling party has been winning elections using the State machinery," said BJP state general secretary. He said the officers had taken an oath to work for the State by staying impartial and such subservience to political masters "is a crime against the people of Odisha".

Congress leader Satya Nayak said that the real cadre of the BJD is the State bureaucracy. "They congratulated Mr. Patnaik on his party's political victory. It is a violation of the service code of conduct by the IAS and IPS officers. The bureaucracy as an institution has ceased to exist in the State," he said.

Retired IAS and IPS officers too expressed shock over officers being paraded before the head of a political party following its victory in the grassroots-level elections. "It has been a tradition that the State's Chief Secretary and DGP usually go to wish a Chief Minister who returns to power following a State election. But officers going to congratulate the CM for a party victory has never been witnessed before," said a former Odisha Chief Secretary.



Connotation of the BJD Victory in Odisha's ULB Polls

There are lessons to be learnt on how a regional party like the BJD has repeatedly defeated the saffron party

The Biju Janata Dal (BJD) registered an impressive victory in the elections for urban local bodies across Odisha, consigning the BJP to a distant second place. The result reaffirmed BJD's uninterrupted "pro-incumbency", spanning 23 years. This is rare in the annals of the electoral history of Odisha and India.

Out of a total of 108 urban local bodies, the BJD registered a thumping victory in 95, and the BJP and Congress were relegated to distant second and third positions by winning only 6 and 4 respectively. Independent candidates could win only in 3 councils.

The much higher vote share of the BJD over the BJP and the Congress in these elections reveals the former's preeminent position over its opponents.

Tum agar miljao, Odisha chhod denge hum direct elections conducted for the post of chairpersons of different urban local bodies and mayors of the three municipal corporations, the BJD registered an overwhelming victory, and its vote shares a staggering 48%. The BJP and the Congress could gather only 29%

and 12% of the votes.

For instance, for the elections of councilors, the BJD's vote share is a whopping 50% - in contrast with the BJP and Congress's vote shares of 27% and 12% respectively. The vote share of independent candidates was just 9%. It is instructive to note that in the

The BJP's poor performance in 2022 stands in sharp contrast to its record of winning nearly 300 Zilla Parishad seats in 2017. The BJP's electoral debacle in Odisha comes close on the heels of its recent successes in assembly elections in Uttar Pradesh,

Uttarakhand, Manipur, and Goa is also significant.

Such a downfall for the saffron party - which often touts itself as the biggest party in the world - has prompted many commentators and analysts to question: are regional parties in a better position to defeat the BJP than national ones like the Congress?

Odisha CM and BJD president Naveen Patnaik in a tweet said his party's huge victory proves that people at the ward and grassroots levels have reaffirmed their trust and faith in the party. Let us have a look at the factors behind the party's victory.

While the BJD's wins have become a routine aspect of Odisha politics for more than two decades, they should not be understood only in terms of seats won and vote shares secured. It has other deeper dimensions which are as significant to the society and polity of Odisha as they are for the whole of India, which is confronting divisive and polarised narratives since 2014.

The BJD's victory owed a lot to the support of the Other Backward Classes (OBCs). The policy stances taken by Patnaik and concrete measures adopted by him in the recent past for the inclusion of OBCs in several aspects of governance and his support to conduct a caste census have endeared him to the OBCs.

The other distinguishing aspect of the BJD's victory in Zilla Parishads is that in its long list of winning candidates, more than 60% are women. Women have emerged as presidents of 70% of the Zilla Parishads - more than the 50%reserved for women.

In elections to choose the mayors for Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, and Berhampur cities, two women from the BJD emerged victorious - Sulochana Das in Bhubaneswar and Sanghamitra Dalai in Berhampur. These events are a clear sign of the BJD's commitment to giving more opportunities to women in the electoral fray and ensuring their representation in local body

Huge representation of women at the grassroots level has made local bodies a nursery for women leaders, allowing them to address governance problems from their unique perspective but also helping them take the plunge into the rough and tumble of politics and public life.

In the 2019 general elections, the BJD had fielded seven women candidates - 33% of the state's 21 Lok Sabha seats. That historic and trendsetting decision - not just for Odisha but the whole country - was fruitful, and five women won.

Representation and empowerment of women flow from Naveen Patnaik's initiative in 2003. It mobilizes women through self-help groups (SHGs) and involves them in government programs. So far, eight million women are part of SHGs. Their support for the BJD is critical in winning elections - whether for the Lok Sabha, assembly, Zilla Parishads, or urban local bodies. Patnaik is aware of the role women play in his party's successes. He acknowledged that on the occasion of the BJD's foundation day in 2020 that women of Odisha constitute the party's mainstay.

One is mindful that the BJD has supported several legislations initiated by the Narendra Modi government in parliament. However, that should not diminish the meaning of the BJD's massive victory over the BJP and Congress in these elections.

If we see the outcome of the 22 local and urban polls, contrastingly, we find BJP has never fought the elections. None of the saffron leaders came to campaigns because of the factionalism in the party. Odisha's all eight Lok Sabha members of the BJP didn't join the polls by heart and soul. Nevertheless, there was no homework, no joint de-

cision under the direction of a commanding leader.

In addition, fresh from a crushing defeat in the panchayat elections, odds are stacked against the BJP to face another election within a short span. Thanks to the undiminished popularity of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik combined with Pyaar byaar politics to kyaa janu re the well-oiled election

machinery of the BJD, sufficient campaign funds, and dozens of ministers and MLAs always ready to carry out the strategy of a micro-managing core team. With all these, the electoral battle of the ruling party turns into virtually an unbreakable fortress.

In contrast, the BJP appears diminutive with no charismatic leader and no funds to take on the mighty BJD. The massive victory of the regional party in the panchayat elections has demoralized the BIP to such an extent that not many are keen to contest the forthcoming polls to urban local bodies. Finding candidates for seats reserved for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes has become a tough job for the BJP.

"While the BJD has started poaching a few known faces close to the BJP, certain of a defeat, others are reluctant to contest on party symbol fearing a backlash after the election," said a senior leader of the saffron party. While BJD is struggling with a large crowd of aspirants and many of them trying to show their strength with supporters before the residence of their local MLAs, BJP party offices are wearing a deserted look.

While funds and friendship with BJP's central leaders are not a constraint for the BID. the case is just reverse for the BJP state unit. The BJP had given Rs 50,000 to each candidate who contested for the post of corporator in 2013 ULB+



elections. The mayoral candidates were given Rs 5 lakh each. Admitting the fund constraints, State BJP president Samir Mohanty says, "I have no hesitation to say that we are having dearth of funds. The BJD has made election a costly affair."If a BJD candidate could spend at least Rs 30 lakh in the zilla parishad election, one can imagine what will be expenditure for a corporator candidate in municipal corporation poll, he wondered. If BJP that claims to be the largest party in the globe doesn't seriously look into its flaws in Odisha- it has to forget to set foot in the Eastern coast of the country in the near future.



Prime Accused of Manas Murder, Sharmishta Rout, Her Associate Arrested By CB

Bhubaneswar, March 28: After remaining on the run for the past few days, Sharmishta Rout, the prime accused in the sensational murder case of cameraman Manas Swain, was arrested by the State Crime Branch on Monday.

Along with Sharmishta, her associate Jhuna Bhoi has also been arrested from Nalanga area of Bhadrak district. The duo was arrested by joint teams of Bhadrak police and Crime Branch. Both Sharmishta and Jhuna were returning to Odisha from Kolkata in a bus when they were apprehended. Sources said Sharmishta had spent few



days in Kolkata and Guwahati.

"Both the accused will be produced in the Court of JMFC Chandbali today," said Crime Branch ADG Sanjeeb Panda. Senior officials said that the Crime Branch will move court seeking at least ten days remand for Sharmishta, her associate and five more persons arrested earlier in connection with the case. Along with Sharmishta, her associate Jhuna Bhoi has also been arrested from Nalanga area of Bhadrak district. The duo was arrested by joint teams of Bhadrak police and Crime Branch.

Sharmishta Rout is the owner of the web channel where the deceased cameraman Manas Swain worked.

Manas Swain, a resident of Godipokhari village in Ranpur area of Nayagarh had gone missing on February 7. He had reportedly come to Bhadrak from Bhubaneswar for shooting a marriage function when he was abducted, taken to a room at Dayal Ashram in Bhubaneswar, assaulted and tortured. Later, his body was disposed off in Nayagarh.

According to police, Manas was beaten up with bare hands and some weapon. The Chandbali police had recovered Manas' body from Badhipatna hills in Rajsunakhala area of Nayagarh on March 12.

Earlier five persons

including retired Odisha Information Service (OIS) officer Niranjan Sethi have been arrested in connection with the brutal murder of the 28-year-old cameraman.

On Sunday, the Crime Branch has sealed Dayal Ashram, the old age home operated by the prime accused Sharmistha, in Bhubaneswar. The ashram was sealed after the Crime Branch officials along with a forensic team conducted a detailed examination. The team reportedly collected fingerprints from various spots inside the ashram using the 3D camera and CCTV footage of the day of crime.

A great leap in international trade

The new record of \$400 billion of goods exports has made a mark in the global business arena, reclaiming India's status as a major trading power

India's achievement of a record \$400 billion of goods exports is a shining example of the way this country is being governed, reformed, and transformed since 2014 with a mission to decisively improve the lives of citizens. The surge in exports is helping farmers, artisans, weavers and factory workers, and enabling businesses, small and large, create jobs, scale up operations, become more competitive, and make a mark in the global business arena.

The export target of \$400 billion seemed impossible to many in a Covid-ravaged world, where demand was weak, containers were scarce and priced exorbitantly, and the world was facing job losses and conflicts. But this did not deter Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi's government from acting decisively and swiftly with a bottom-up approach in assessing the situation, identifying products and regions where exports could be increased, and adopting a partnership approach with exporters and industry bodies to deliver results.

The exports mission was revved up when the PM gave a clarion call to industry to focus on exports and inspired them

to aspire for a quantum jump in India's international trade in goods and services. The PM himself held consultations with ministries, states, Indian missions abroad, commodity boards, industry associations and experts to motivate and inspire all. He monitored the progress of exports continuously.

It was indeed an ambitious mission because the best India achieved in merchandise exports in the past was \$330 billion in the pre-Covid days of 2018-19, after which the pandemic battered all global trade. But India bounced back rapidly as policy measures, reforms, export-promotion schemes, major initiatives such as the Production Linked Incentive Scheme, and bold decisions in the face of

adversity propelled India to become the fastest growing major economy in the world. Exports boomed, setting a series of monthly records that have added up to historic achievement in 2021-22.

Exports are contributing to

economic growth, creating jobs and helping small businesses and workers. The world is now looking up to India as a trustworthy and reliable partner which can provide quality goods and services on time even at the peak of the pandemic. The results are spectacular. India achieved the target nine days ahead of schedule. We adopted the whole-ofgovernment approach and worked as partners with exporters. The government proactively helped them overcome any hurdle and

encouraged them to grab every opportunity for every product in every country to help achieve the stiff target. Targets were fixed for 200 countries/ territories, and special emphasis was laid on new and existing markets, lost market share, and the role of small enterprises and startups as a vehicle for exports. But it's not just a story of numbers. There are exciting new developments such as the export of new products, penetration of new markets, rising exports of manufactured products, an impressive 50% growth in engineering exports, and laudable contribution of small businesses and farmers, whose hard work has strengthened global food security.

Agricultural exports have risen nearly 25% to a record of nearly \$50 billion. India's farmers provide almost half of the globally traded rice. Farmers have helped wheat exports jump to a record seven million tonnes, which is softening the impact of the disruption in the global wheat trade caused by the crisis in Ukraine, a major supplier. Similarly, coffee exports have risen to a record of nearly \$1 billion, an impressive achievement for the sector

where 95% of the output is from small growers. Marine exports are also booming, helping many small businesses and fishermen.

India now needs to maintain the momentum. Our manufacturers, exporters and policymakers cannot afford to be complacent in a fiercely competitive world. Indian industry needs to step up investment in research and development and focus on quality. There was a time when there was a big gap between products sold to Indian citizens and the export quality goods that were shipped out. There should be no such gap.

The government will scale up efforts to help exporters. Many recent policies will bear fruits for years to come and give the country new global champions in manufacturing and exports. There will be many success stories like the mobile phone sector, which was once heavily import-dependent, but where, now exports have multiplied and imports are drying up. Exporters will also gain from the PM Gati Shakt scheme, the National Master Plan for multimodal connectivity which the PM launched last October. We now have to make a bigger

impact in international trade. This will be challenging, but exciting and achievable. Our government has a track record of achieving very ambitious targets, be it electrification of every village in the country, the dramatic rise in renewable energy capacity along with the equally dramatic fall in its cost, the LED revolution that drastically reduced the cost of energy-efficient bulbs, as well as game-changing welfare schemes to provide ordinary citizens with the convenience of toilets, cooking gas, bank accounts, health insurance, water supply, homes, rural roads, internet connectivity and the world's largest vaccination programme against Covid-19 with the help of vaccines made in India.India is on track to reclaim its status as the major trading power that it once was. That is an ambitious mission, but the story of Indian exports - like many game-changing initiatives in New India - can be summed up with what Nelson Mandela famously said: "It always seems impossible until it's done." What it has done though is to convey that while Delhi cannot consider the relationship normal so long as troops continue to face off at "friction points" in the Ladakh heights, it is prepared to be pragmatic and engage at a fairly high level to talk about other day-to-day issues including trade and visas for students.

The pragmatism has been in evidence even before this. Despite the worst patch in the relations, India-China trade has touched new highs. Even though the words status quo ante was not used, both External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and National Security Adviser A K Doval have conveyed that the Ladakh issue has to be resolved expeditiously before the relationship can become normal. That much was evident in the secrecy around the visit, apparently at the request of the Chinese side, and the palpably cold reception Wang received in



Delhi. If Wang was keen to convey where he was coming from - quite literally from Pakistan, where he backed OIC's "aspirations" for Kashmir, and Afghanistan, where he welcomed the Taliban's desire to participate in the Belt and Road Initiative, both red rags for Delhi - India responded in kind by lashing out at him

for his remarks on Kashmir, on which it said China had "no locus standi to comment", and pointing out that India refrains from commenting on China's "internal issues".

While India rightly focused on the Ladakh border, from the Chinese point of view, the visit was likely made to gauge if India

would be willing to play ball by attending, at a time of great geopolitical flux, the BRICS summit in June this year in China, as well as the Russia-India-China summit. For Beijing and Moscow. having Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Russian President Vladimir Putin and Chinese President Xi Jinping, along with the leaders of South Africa and Brazil, would be an important diplomatic victory. For now, Delhi appears to have conveyed that despite their common stand on Russia's invasion of Ukraine, both sides have their "respective" positions. The call - to attend or not - will have to be made soon, and the decision weighed against what could be gained and what might be lost.

Patnaik who took a chartered flight from the Biju Patnaik airport in Bhubaneswar is scheduled to attend the BBC Sports

Woman of the Year Award ceremony in Delhi on Monday evening.

Patnaik had last visited Delhi in September 2021 to attend a meeting of chief ministers of Maoist-hit states convened by Union home minister Amit Shah.

BJD MP Pinaki Mishra said Patnaik's schedule of

meeting leaders of other parties is not clear yet, however BJD insiders indicated that the chief minister would meet leaders of both BJP as well as opposition parties.

The Odisha CM's visit has assumed significance considering that the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance government is about 1.2 per cent away from the total votes it needs for its candidate to win.

BJP's numbers in Uttar Pradesh and the Uttarakhand legislative assembly elections have come down and that has led to a fall in vote-share. In UP assembly, BJP's number has dipped from 312 to 255 between 2017 and 2022. In the current assembly, BJP's allies have 17 members taking the total to 273.

So, the support of the Biju Janata Dal and YSR Congress Party will be crucial for the BJP. With 112 MLAs and 21 MPs in the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, Patnaik controls 23,072 votes which would be more than enough for the NDA candidate to win.

People aware of the matter said that Patnaik is likely to hold discussions with BJP leaders about getting one of the 4 Rajya Sabha seats that are going to fall vacant. While 3 seats are going to be vacant on July 1, the seat held by Subas Singh will fall vacant after he resigns from the membership following his election as Mayor of the Cuttack Municipal

Chinese Foreign Minister gets a cold welcome in New Delhi

Flew into New Delhi from Kabul and is set to hold talks with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar



New Delhi, March 24: China's foreign minister Wang Yi has reached Delhi -- the first high-level Chinese visit to India in more than two years, since the stand-off in Ladakh started. Sources said Wang Yi is expected to meet foreign minister S Jaishankar and National Security Advisor Ajit Doval on Friday.

The aim of Wang Yi's visit is to restart physical engagement and also invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi for a BRICS meeting to be hosted by Beijing later this year, news agency Press Trust of India has reported.

The suspense over the visit persisted till the last minute and there was no official confirmation of the visit even when the Chinese minister landed in Delhi. The landing could be confirmed only through tracking the flight path of his plane, which took off from Afghanistan.

India-China relations have taken a downturn as Chinese incursions became more frequent in Ladakh and led to the clash in Galwan Valley in which 20 Indian and several Chinese soldiers died.

Repeated rounds of military-level talks have led to deescalation -- the two sides completed the disengagement process last year in the north and south banks of the Pangong Lake and in the Gogra area. But there has been no return to the status quo that prevailed before 2020.

On March 11, India and China held the 15th round of military dialogue to resolve the pending issues.

Defects pointed out again in Odisha's PMAY implementation

Officials said an Action Taken Report of the state government was earlier found to be unsatisfactory and not accepted

Bhubaneswar, March 18: Over a year after a Union rural development ministry team flagged irregularities in the construction of houses under the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana-Gramin scheme in Odisha, it has again pointed out flaws in the scheme's implementation following its second visit to the state this month.

Officials said the team revisited the state in the first week of March and found that despite an advisory for the PMAY-G logo on the houses constructed under the scheme, the logo of Biju Pucca Ghar, a state government scheme, continue. "In most of the cases, the logo of Biju Pucca Ghar was more prominent than the PMAY-G logo. The construction continued to be poor and Awaas survey was not conducted properly," the team said in its fresh report. Officials said the second visit came after the Action Taken Report of the state government on the earlier findings in February last year was found to be unsatisfactory. The ministry did not accept the report. Under PMAY-G, the ministry gives ?1.3 lakh assistance to the homeless in Maoist violence-hit and ?1.2 lakh in other areas to build a minimum of 25 square metre cemented houses. The beneficiary can also avail of 90/95-day wages under the Mahatma Gandhi National Employment Guarantee Scheme. ?2,000 are also provided for the construction of toilets under the Swachh Bharat Mission. The Centre and the state provide assistance to the beneficiaries in the ratio of 60:40. As per the ministry's portal, of the 2.69 million houses sanctioned to Odisha under the scheme, 1.68 million, roughly 62%, have

been completed.

In February last year, a team led by deputy directorgeneral (PMAY-G) Gaya Prasad visited Odisha for an inquiry into state Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) complaints of irregularities in the beneficiary selection. It found violations of norms. The BJP has alleged 85% of the PMAY-G beneficiaries in



scheme and most of the funds were utilised for personal gains. It also alleged members of the same families have been sanctioned houses under the scheme.

The central team found some houses were shown to have been completed, but they were incomplete. In some cases, houses were sanctioned to members of the same family. In several houses, the PMAY-G logo was missing.

The ministry later wrote to Odisha chief secretary Suresh Mohapatra suggesting the money sanctioned to ineligible beneficiaries be recovered and cases lodged against government officials for the lapses. It asked the state to take measures to improve the quality of the houses and bring them to a liveable standard.

Odisha submitted its report in July 2021, justifying the Biju Pucca Ghar Yojana logo on the houses as the state government has provided 40% money for them.

Odisha panchayatiraj secretary AKK Meena said he is yet to get the fresh report of the central team and would be unable to comment.

Union minister and BJP leader Bishweswar Tudu accused the ruling Biju Janata Dal of favouritism and gifting ineligible party workers PMAY houses instead of deserving beneficiaries to strengthen its vote bank. "Scams to the tune of crores of rupees have been committed in the execution of PMAY in the state...the real beneficiaries have been deprived of its benefit." He added Prime Minister Narendra Modi set a target to provide concrete houses to all eligible beneficiaries under the scheme by 2022. "However, the target has so far remained unfulfilled due to the negligence of the state government."

Man shot dead in Kerala's Idukki after a tiff over beef curry at roadside eatery



Moolamattum (Kerala), March 27: A man was shot dead and two others injured on Saturday night after an inebriated young man who was annoyed with a roadside eatery in Moolamattum in Idukki district for not serving beef curry, fired shots at a crowd with a country-made weapon, police said.

Philip Martin (26) and two of his friends visited a roadside eating joint (thattu kada) and asked for food. The owner of the eatery, a woman, told them that their favourite dish- beef curry- was over. But they started verbally abusing the owner and later when other customers questioned them, a scuffle took place inside the eatery, the police said.

Martin left the place immediately and headed for his house nearby. He came back with a revolver and fired at least five rounds, police said. One of the bullets hit Sanal Babu (34), a bus conductor, who was standing outside the shop. A bullet hit him on his neck and he died on the way to the hospital while two others were also injured. Both of them are, however, out of danger.

"The accused is under custody and we found that the revolver was locally-made and we have identified the blacksmith also. We will charge Martin for murder and other charges. His friends will also be detained for questioning," said station house officer E K Soli Mon.

In Jagatsinghpur, a beetle shop owner, Debasish Swain not only won the councillor position in Ward number 17 but he defeated candidates of all three major political parties. His victory, despite money power and campaigns by Odisha Ministers and MLAs, has earned him a name in the region.

However, he will not stop selling paan in his shop, Swain said.

Uniform Civil Code in U'khand Soon

The Uniform Civil Code essentially calls for the formulation of one law for India, applicable to all religious communities in their personal matters such as marriage, divorce, inheritance, adoption etc

New Delhi, March 24: Keeping his poll promise, Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Thursday announced to implement the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) and said that the state cabinet has unanimously approved that a committee of experts will be formed at the earliest for the same. He said that Uttarakhand will be the first state to implement such a code but quickly added that "perhaps it is already in force in Goa".

Uniform Civil Code has been one of the main poll planks of the BJP over the past several decades. The saffron party has been a strong advocate of UCC and its MPs have previously listed Private Member's Bills, advocating for its implementation.

Addressing the media after his first state cabinet meeting, Dhami said the BJP-led state government will form a committee that will prepare "a draft of the UCC and our government will implement it". "We have decided to implement the Uniform Civil Code in the state. The state cabinet

unanimously approved that a committee (of experts) will be constituted at the earliest and it will be implemented in the state. We also expect other states to follow us," he said.

"We are a Himalayan state with a distinct cultural and religious heritage. We also share borders with two countries. So, a Uniform Civil Code is necessary. There is a provision for it in Article 44 of the Constitution. Even the Supreme Court has expressed its dissatisfaction in the past on its non-implementation,"

he added.

Dhami, who was sworn in as Uttarakhand's Chief Minister for the second consecutive term on Wednesday, had said that he will provide a transparent government and fulfill the BJP's all pre-poll commitments, including bringing a Uniform Civil Code in the state.

'A SIGNIFICANT STEP'

On February 12, Dhami had promised that the BJP if re-elected to power in Uttarakhand will constitute a committee to prepare a draft Uniform Civil Code soon after its new government is sworn in. The panel will comprise legal experts, retired people, intellectuals, and other stakeholders, he had announced on the last day of campaigning for the 70 assembly seats in Uttarakhand that went to polls on February 14.

The ambit of the committee will cover issues related to marriage, divorce, landed property succession, he had said in Hindi in a video statement, adding, "It will be a significant step towards fulfilling the dreams of India's Constitution makers and will realise the spirit of the Constitution. It will also be an effective step towards Article 44 of the Indian Constitution which presents the concept of equitable law for all citizens of society regardless of their religion."

From time to time, the Supreme Court, too, has underscored the need for a Uniform Civil Code and also expressed concern over no steps being taken in this

direction, he had said, adding that the BJP government in Uttarakhand will derive inspiration for the decision from Goa which has set an example before the country by implementing a common civil code will promote social amity and gender equality besides strengthening women empowerment, Dhami added.

For the unversed, in 2019, a Supreme Court bench had expressed disappointment over the lack of UCC, saying, "Whereas the founders of the Constitution in Article 44 in Part IV dealing with the Directive Principles of State Policy had hoped and expected that the State shall endeavour to secure for the citizens a Uniform Civil Code throughout the territories of India, till date no action has been taken in this regard."

WHAT IS UNIFORM CIVIL CODE?

The Uniform Civil Code (UCC) essentially calls for the formulation of one law for India, applicable to all religious communities in their personal matters such as marriage, divorce,

inheritance, adoption etc. It comes under Article 44 of the Constitution, which lays down that the state shall endeavour to secure a Uniform Civil Code for the citizens throughout the territory of India.

Currently, different laws regulate these aspects in India for adherents of different religions, for example, Hindu Marriage Act, Hindu Succession Act, Indian Christian Marriages Act, Parsi Marriage and Divorce Act. However, Muslim personal laws are not codified and are based on their religious texts.

ABOUT GOA CIVIL CODE

Goa has been following the Portuguese Civil Code, 1867 which is also called Uniform Civil Code, Post its liberation from the Portuguese rule, the code is survived by virtue of Section 5(1) of the Goa, Daman and Diu Administration Act, 1962. Its continuance amounts to the non-enforcement of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and Hindu Succession Act, 1956 or Indian Succession Act, 1925 or Shariat (Application) Act, 1937.

The First Live Sighting of "Rough toothed dolphins" in Indian Water

The Marine Mammals Research team working under the Department of Environment & Forest, Lakshadweep has reported the first every live sightings of Rough-toothed dolphins in Indian waters. Earlier reports of the species are only three

(www.marinemammals.in) and are stranding events on the east coast of India. Dr. Ahmed Amirsha, Senior Project Officer and his 9 members team (Sinan Yafus, Afsal, Jaseem, Salih, Jowhar, Shafi, Wasih, Saifudheen and Muhammed Koya) were

involved to conducting a dedicated line transect survey during February to March 2022 around Lakshadweep Archipelago and they reported the first live sighting records of Rough-toothed dolphins in Indian waters.

During their diversity and distribution monitoring surveys the marine mammal research team first sighted the species on 12/2/2022 and the new species identified with the help of Dr. Dipani Sutaria (Consultant CMM). The observers noticed the lack of a crease between the head and the beak, that is usually present in all small sized dolphins, but the animals in this particular group lacked this crease, one of the most identifiable characters of the species. Though it is the ridges on their teeth that gives them their common name. The species has been sighted twice. Once at Cheriyapani on 12/02/2022 (group size= 35) and Kavaratti on 07/03/2022 (group size =10). The groups were socially tight with the presence of adults, sub adults and calves. They have been seen to associate with other cetacean species, including short-finned pilot whales, bottlenose dolphins, Pantropical spotted dolphins, and spinner dolphins. They are known to eat squid and different types of fish based on which they are distributed in the worlds oceans...

Rough toothed dolphins are found in tropical and warmer temperate waters all over the world but at the same time are rare and data deficient. They can grow up to 8.5ft in length and have gray bodies with white lips and throat and a speckled belly. When they are observed, they are usually seen in small tight knit groups of around 20 animals or less. Rough-toothed dolphins can live for up to 36 or so years. Sexual maturity occurs at 10 to 14 years of age.

The worldwide population of rough-toothed dolphins is unknown. Given the lack of data population estimates, prey preference, social structure and habitat use, for the species, dedicated surveys in hotspots around oceanic island systems such as Lakshadweep is recommended.

Muslim woman's historic win in Odisha Civic polls

Bhadrak, March 27: The 31-year-old Gulmaki Dalawzi Habib, an independent candidate, won the election to chairperson of Bhadrak Municipality by defeating nearest rival Samita Mishra, Biju Janata Dal (BJD) candidate, by 3.256 votes.

The recently concluded civic body polls was a turning point for minority community in Odisha's poll history with with voters directly electing a woman from the Muslim community as chairperson of any urban local body for the first time.

The 31-year-old Gulmaki Dalawzi Habib, an independent candidate, won the election to chairperson of Bhadrak Municipality by defeating nearest rival Samita Mishra, Biju Janata Dal (BJD) candidate, by 3,256 votes.

Habib, who is a Business Administration graduate and a professional data entry operator, attributes her victory to people's trust and the mutual goal of Bhadrak's development. She claims to be a political novice but comes from a family with a political pedigree. Her husband, Sheikh Jahid Habib, is the BJD's district vice president.

There had been a demand for fielding a person from the minority community as candidate for civic body chairperson in Bhadrak where a Muslim community has a sizeable population. As the post was reserved for women, Ms. Habib became the unanmous choice. However, she had to face the ire of the ruling BJD.

Communal tensions
Initially it was believed that



it would not be smooth sailing for Ms. Habib as Bhadrak has a history of communal tensions.

"During my campaign, I had

not come across any reservation in minds of voters towards Muslim woman candidate. People treated me like their daughter irrespective of the community they belong to," said Ms. Habib who would soon be sworn as chairperson of Bhadrak Municipal Corporation.

Though Muslim women had won direct elections for post of councillors or wardmembers, this is for the first time; a muslim woman was first choice of voters for leading a town.

"In Odisha's poll history, not a single woman has been elected as MLA. Even Muslim communities are very reluctant to send woman members to fight elections. After the Odisha government reserved seats for women in three-tier panchayati raj institutions and civic bodies, Muslim women are coming forward to fight elections," said Mohammed Akbar Ali, who was chairperson of Kendrapara

Muncipality for six years from 1984 to 1990.

Muslim community constitutes less than 3% of Odisha's population. There have been very few representation of minority community in the State's politics, though members of Muslim community had gone on to become Cabinet Ministers in the State.

Similarly, journalist-turned-politician Sulochana Das became the first woman Mayor of Bhubaneswar. Prior to her election as first citizen of Bhubaneswar, she was Commissioner of Persons with Disabilities.

"I want to give further push to development initiative taken in Bhubaneswar. People would surely take pride for being citizen of the capital city," said Ms. Das after her victory.

Bhuvan Shome: When Mrinal Sen started Indian cinema's new wave with Amitabh Bachchan, paid him just Rs 300



Mrinal Sen's Bhuvan Shome was the film that started the era of the Indian new wave in cinema. It is interesting to note that this was also the first paying gig of Amitabh Bachchan. Mrinal Sen's Bhuvan Shome won three National Film Awards in 1969.

When acclaimed filmmaker Mrinal Sen made Bhuvan Shome as his first Hindi film, he wasn't aware that this film would get him the credit of starting the New Wave of Indian cinema. And when the film did exceptionally well with niche audiences, Sen was in for a shock. The 1969 film is often cited as the film that made 'art cinema' palatable for the audience as it had all the elements that were used in the 'mainstream films', yet its presentation was refined, classic, and the kind that left a lasting impression. The 1969 film starred Utpal Dutt as the titular character who can be easily described as a strict bureaucrat who lives a solitary life until one day, he decides to step out of his comfort zone and realises that life

is best lived with people. When he meets Suhasini Mulay's Gauri, his softer side emerges, something that he hasn't experienced in years.

The 90-minutes of Bhuvan Shome are not dictated by a strict story but are rather a collection of experiences that introduce the audience to some 'new wave' elements that were not seen by the Indian audience until then. The freeze frames where Utpal's inner monologue emerges- a narrator who is borderline sarcastic, and animation sequences that establish that the film is a surrealistic take on the theme of loneliness.

It is interesting to note that this was the first film gig for Amitabh Bachchan, who is credited without his surname in the opening credits. In his book, Always Being Born - A Memoir, Sen mentioned that he had to insist that Bachchan take a cheque for the film and that cheque was just for Rs 300. Bachchan, who eventually became a poster boy for everything that mainstream

cinema stood for, made his first income from the movies in a rather non-commercial film.

The themes of Bhuvan Shome have been interpreted in various ways in the decades since it came out. Many see the film as a lonely man's journey to finding company, but there has been much conversation about the film having erotic undertones. When Shome meets Gauri, he is surprised at her welcoming nature. The film's subtext and some of the close-ups of the two characters hint at the sexual undertones as Shome lets his guard and accepts her company on his day-long adventure of trying to hunt birds. Shome's hunt for trying to find a flock of birds subtly hints towards his inner desire to be in a society where he is surrounded by people. Something, that he has distanced himself from. While he did so willingly, he is starting to question his decision after meeting Gauri.

Satyajit Ray, who was often seen as Sen's competitor, wrote a long essay regarding the film and described it as - 'Big Bad Bureaucrat Reformed by Rustic Belle'. Sen, in his memoir, wrote in response, "My business, to write in plain and simple language, was not to reform the bureaucrat because he belonged to an incorrigible tribe. Bhuvan Shome, as I saw him on the screen, was an arrogant man, lonely and sad, who finally came to a tragic realisation, burlesque and tragic nonsense acting as facade."

Bhuvan Shome marked the debut of Suhasini Mulay

One of the most arresting sequences of the film comes when Gauri is showing Bhuvan around a 'purani haveli' and recalls the stories of rajas and maharajas who lived there. She sits in a corner and narrates the story of rani who had a 'jhula' on the same spot. She puts her arms up as if she is sitting on a swing and KK Mahajan (the director of photography), zooms in and out to give the impression of a swing in motion. Mahajan utilises the camera in a way that highlights the loneliness that has engulfed Shome and slowly gives space to others who are now welcomed in his life.

Bhuvan Shome was made on a budget of just Rs 2 lakh and was

financed by Film Finance Corporation (now known as NFDC), but it gained an audience that Sen had not expected. In his memoir, Sen narrated an incident where he was once travelling with a chatty cab driver in Mumbai, and to shut him up, he asked if the man had seen Bhuvan Shome. Expecting that he must have not, thought that Sen conversation would end but to his surprise, the taxi driver asked, 'The one with the birds?' and described it as a 'class film'. Upon learning Sen's identity, the taxi driver did not say another word for the rest of the ride and refused to take the fare.

Bhuvan Shome won three National Film Awards - Best Feature Film, Best Director and Best Actor. Sen was a pioneer in Indian cinema but amongst all his great works Bhuvan Shome stands tall for being the film that started the new wave in India in a way that was accepted by the audience and gave them something to dissect even years after the film's
